O"KNOW THE FACTS & STATS"

FACTS:

- Victims of sexual violence do not invite or cause the assault to happen. Only the person initiating the sexually violent act is responsible.
- Sexual Assaults are committed primarily out of anger and/or a need to feel powerful, to control and dominate another person.
- Victims of sexual violence are forced, coerced or manipulated to participate in unwanted sexual activity.
- Victims are usually traumatized by the assault. Friends and family members may also experience a trauma reaction.

FACTS:

O Sexual Assault is a crime of violence affecting women, children and men in all counties in Arkansas, regardless of race, culture, age or socio-economic status.

In Arkansas, professionals are required to report the crime of sexual assault:

- if the victim is a child
- Was assaulted by someone in a position of trust or authority (i.e., coaches, psychotherapists, scout leaders, teachers, priests, etc.)
- Is physically, emotionally, or mentally disadvantaged.
- Sexual assault, whether it happens to you or someone you know, is a major life-changing event.
- It can create roadblocks to normal life at home, at work, or at school, and affect relationships with friends, family, or co-workers.

FACTS:

- Sexual Assault is intentional sexual contact, characterized by the use of force, threat, abuse of authority, or when the victim does not or cannot consent. This includes: rape, non-consensual sodomy, indecent assault, or any attempts to commit these acts.
- Sexual Assault can occur without regard to gender, spousal relationship, or age of the victim.
- Sexual Assault is a Crime punishable under the state and federal laws.

O The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Sexual Assault Prevention & Response Program (SAPR) under the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) is dedicated to assisting United States Military Service Members, including Guard and Reservists, as well as their eligible adult dependents, access to resources such as medical and counseling services, Law enforcement investigation, and Command involvement.

DoD Restricted Report

- Confidential (information that remain confidential when it is disclosed to the SARC
- Access to Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC) and/or Victim Advocate (VA)
- Access to medical and counseling services

FACTS:

- O Marital rape is the term used to describe nonconsensual sexual acts between a woman and her husband, ex-husband or intimate long-term partner.
- These sexual acts can include: intercourse, anal or oral sex, forced sexual behavior with other individuals, and other unwanted, painful, and humiliating sexual activities.
- It is rape is your partner uses force, threats, or intimidation to get you to submit to sexual acts.

STATS:

- O Every 60 seconds, 1.3 women (18+) in the U.S. are forcibly raped.
- 78 each hour
- 1,871 each day
- 683,000 each year

STATS:

- 061.9% of rape occurs by Intimate Partner
- 21.3% of rape is by an Acquaintance
- 16.7% of rape is by a Stranger
- 0 6.5% of rape is by a Relative-other than spouse or partner

STATS:

- 60% Victims Don Not go to Police
- 25% of Reported sexual assaults actually lead to arrest
- 10% Sexual assaults involve attacks against males
- Over 40% of College Women experience violent or abuse behavior while in College
